

# Pupils go all out for the hungry

More than 70 Cotswold School pupils have completed the 20 and 40-hour famines to 'Go Hard Out for the Hungry'.

Children could choose from completing a 20-hour no food famine or any one of the 40-hour famines of no technology, no talking or sleeping in a cardboard box.

Cotswold School teacher Liz Davies said the money raised was still being collected and counted.

However, five students — Kelly Neil, Tyler Askin, Joshua Baxter, Lauren Corson and Abigail Winter — raised more than \$100. Ms These five children will be helping 100 children in East Timor to have food for one year.

Liz Davies said the children had made a great effort.

"Just \$40 raised can buy seed to help 10 children in East Timor to have food for a whole year," she said.

In the last two years Cotswold school children have raised more than \$2200 each year.
